The Freemasons Victoria United Ararat Lodge Social Club and Freemasons Benevolent Fund jointly donated \$5750 towards the Dialysis Unit Treatment Chair Replacement Project.

The Freemasons joined the 2019 Murray to Moyne Cycle Relay teams and the East Grampians Health Service Auxiliary in fundraising for the project to replace seven chairs.

The aim of the project was to improve the health and wellbeing of patients who undergo dialysis treatment several times a week, and who have to sit for up to four to five hours at a time.

The treatment chairs were found to be ageing and no longer suitable for either patients undergoing treatment or staff treating the patients.

The new treatment chairs are state-of-the-art and feature safety and comfort features that ensure patients are not put at risk while sitting for extended periods of time and have already significantly improved their lives.

"The donation made a significant contribution towards the replacement of seven chairs in the Dialysis Unit at East Grampians Health Service," EGHS chief executive Andrew Freeman said.

"On behalf of the board and staff at East Grampians Health Service, I would like to thank the local Ararat Freemasons as well as the Freemasons Benevolent Fund for their generous donation."

The benefits of the new area include more modern facilities with additional space, access to the Ark Toy and Activity Library for mothers' groups, and it is close to allied health services such as speech therapy, physiotherapy, dental and dietitians.

The new space is now a one stop shop for families with dedicated carparks out the front which make it easier for parents to park their cars close to the service.

The maternal and child health nurses now also have the support of other nurses and allied health staff in the building and have a greater connection with the East Grampians Health service midwifery department.

National Radiographer and Radiation Therapists' Week 4 – 10 November 2019



What is radiation

has enough energy to change the chemical composition of matter.

Non-ionising radiation has less energy but can still excite
molecules and atoms causing them to vibrate faster.



What else emits radiation?

Fluorescent lights, lasers and intense Pulsed Light (IPL), radioactive waste. They all have very different levels of radiation – seek advice if you're not sure about recommended levels.

What is medical imaging (radiography) and radiation therapy?

Radiography is the art and science of using radiation to provide images of the tissues, organs, bones, and vessels that comprise the human body.

Radiation therapy uses the information from diagnostic images for the treatment of abnormal tissues utilising high energy X-rays.





What is a medical radiation professional (MRP)?

Medical radiation professionals work in three main areas: diagnostic radiography, radiation therapy and nuclear medicine technology. MRP's are able to work and practice both clinically and in academic or research areas.

Items can be borrowed from the Toy Library for up to four weeks, although in special circumstances a longer loan period may be granted. Items are expected to be returned to the Toy Library clean and in good condition.

The Toy Library also caters for mums (and dads) and bubs groups from Ararat and across the wider region. Parents with babies through to preschoolers are welcome to join these groups.

The Toy Library offers an affordable annual membership subscription of just \$10 per family.

ZUCCHINI NOODLES WITH CREAMY AVOCADO PESTO

INGREDIENTS:

- 6 large zucchini, spiralized
- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 ripe avocados
- 1 cup fresh basil leaves
- 3 cloves garlic
- ¼ cup pine nuts
- 2 Tbsp lemon juice
- ½ tsp. sea salt
- 3 Tbsp olive oil
- Cracked black pepper, to taste

METHOD:

- Spiralise your zucchini and set aside on paper towels so that any excess water is soaked up.
- In a food processor, add avocados, basil leaves, garlic, pine nuts, lemon juice and sea salt and pulse until finely chopped. Then with the motor still running, add olive oil in a slow stream until emulsified and creamy.
- Drizzle olive oil in a large skillet over medium high heat then add zucchini noodles, cooking for about 1 to 2 minutes until tender.
- 4. Add zucchini noodles to a large bowl and toss with avocado pesto. Season with cracked pepper and a little Parmesan, serve and enjoy!
