EGHS PROJECTS

SOLAR PANELS REDUCING POWER COSTS

EGHS has successfully completed a solar power initiative, installing 938 panels across the Ararat and Willaura campuses, thanks to a generous bequest from the late Joe Kapp.

Due to the high energy consumption and with adopting solar panels as a cost effective and sustainable solution, EGHS's energy costs will be reduced by approximately \$79,000 per annum.

EGHS has been working with Ballarat Renewable Energy and Zero Emissions Inc (BREAZE) through Ballarat's Community Power Hub program and has received funding of \$650,000 to also install solar car park shelters.



70 LOWE STREET REFURBISHMENT

East Grampians Health Service received funding under the Department of Health and Human Services, Ageing and Aged Care Branch Significant Facility Refurbishment Initiative 2018-19 for refurbishment works at 70 Lowe Street.

The initiative is designed for projects to deliver significant improvements for aged care residents through enhanced facility quality and amenities.

Through this funding, we have enhanced common areas, adjusted communal spaces and improved resident access to catering.

The scope of works came from the introduction of a user group meeting which included residents, residents' families, consumers and staff.

The kitchen extension included a servery and buffet breakfast area to encourage residents' meal choice and preferences, supporting their independence, health, well-being and quality of life.

Other works included vinyl floor covering to assist with the mobility and independence of residents, a dado rail in all residents' rooms to increase the homely feeling in their rooms, large Smart televisions in residents' rooms and LED lighting throughout the individual rooms and all common areas.

REDEVELOPMENT OF THEATRE, RADIOLOGY AND PATHOLOGY

East Grampians Health Service has received funding of \$7.4 million to redevelop/upgrade the theatre, radiology and pathology departments.

The redevelopment will further enhance the care provided to allow people to access quality healthcare in the local community.

HSPC (Health Science Architects) have been engaged and staff and community representatives were involved in the planning and design of the departments EGHS is currently seeking tenders for the project. It is anticipated the project will commence late October 2020 and will run over approximately an 18-month period.
