CE Report

Welcome to the September edition of the Echo.

The Health Services Plan has been released with the recommendation for directed consolidations of health services not to be proceeded with. This has been an enormous relief for many staff and community members.



In July 2023, the Department of Health commissioned an Expert Advisory Committee to examine the design and governance of Victoria's health services' system. The committee recently submitted its Health Services Plan to the Victorian Government for consideration, and the Government has accepted 26 of the 27 recommendations in the plan, in whole or in principle.

They did not accept the recommendation relating to directed consolidations of health services. I was delighted when the Victorian Health Minister came out on August 12 to say:

'The Government has accepted in full or in principle 26 out of 27 recommendations from the report, which provides an excellent foundation for us to build a better connected, easier-to-access health system for all Victorians. Importantly – I want you to know that the Government does not accept the recommendation relating to directed consolidations of health services.

While the committee's advice was that directed consolidations were expected to yield the greatest benefits for patients and the workforce – we do not believe that imposing change on health services and their communities will result in better patient care. We know that it's important we listen to your feedback and broader community views on strengthening our world-class health system that works better for all Victorians'.

Premier Jacinta Allan said, 'We believe that locals know their community health needs best and – together with their health service leaders – their voices must be listened to in the delivery of local health care'.

What are the next steps?

Local Health Service Networks' geographic groupings will be developed. These networks will be responsible for planning and managing care so that it meets the population's health needs of their communities. These Networks will replace Health Partnerships. Once established, Service the Network will share functions such as payroll and IT, including an Electronic Medical Record.

Formalised relationships between each Network, a women's, children's, and a major tertiary hospital ensure that every Victorian has seamless access to specialist care and expertise when they need it.

The most beneficial part of the report for EGHS is its alignment with a women's, children's, and major tertiary hospital. The plan suggests that the Grampian region's health services should align with the Parkville Hospitals, including The Royal Melbourne, Children's, and Women's Hospitals.

To be aligned to these three leading hospitals is a great result for EGHS. The Royal Women's Hospital supported EGHS in the early 2010s with its birthing services. It would be hoped that the Electronic Medical Record 'Epic' used by the Parkville hospital can be extended to the Grampians health services. Hospitals Victoria will be created and be part of the Department of Health. Their focus will be on ensuring that all parts of the health system are financially sustainable. Health services will be supported to reduce non-clinical duplication and double-up. We are always keen to be as careful as possible with taxpayer funds.

East Grampians Health Service is incredibly pleased to offer several educational scholarships in partnership with our generous supporters, the Laidlaw Family, Epworth Healthcare Group, Keith Little, the EGHS Building for the Future Foundation and the Estate of Joe Kapp.

The scholarships are offered to grow and develop the skills of our staff as part of our 'grow our own' strategy. I encourage all staff aspiring to grow and develop professionally to apply for the scholarships. Many of our current services have flourished due to the skill development of our local staff, which scholarships have supported.

The variety and scope of the scholarships are on the EGHS website and in a full-page advertisement in this edition of the ECHO. Applications close Friday, September 13.

It is very pleasing to see the weather improve, and netball and football finals get underway. I understand that a number of our staff are preparing for a top-of-the-table clash in the Mininera A Grade netball: the Ararat Eagles vs. the Tatyoon Hawks. Winning finals' times is important, but that sense of community and connection based on fitness and wellness is even more critical.

Best of luck to all our staff who will participate in finals or have family members competing.

It is very pleasing to see EGHS staff members Russell Purdie, Maree Fraser-Croft, Jodie Holwell, Lionel Holt and Nakara Elliott perform in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. It is great to see the leadership shown by our staff.

BLUE RIBBON FOUNDATION COMMITS TO FUNDING ANAESTHETIC MACHINE JODIE HOLWELL

COMMUNITY LIAISON

The Victoria Police Blue Ribbon Foundation Ararat Branch presented a cheque for \$40,000 to East Grampians Health Service as part of its commitment to the purchase of a new anaesthetic machine.

The \$114,070 anaesthetic machine will be used in the EGHS Jason Bond Perioperative Unit.

The upgrade of the Perioperative Unit was funded by the Ararat Branch in 2015 and included a redesign and refurbishment of the theatre recovery and day procedure unit. It was named in memory of local young man Jason Bond, a police officer in training, who died as a result of a motor vehicle accident in 2011.

The donation, which primarily came from the proceeds of the recent successful Gala Night, is the first instalment in the anaesthetic machine project, with the Branch expecting to make another donation following next year's Grampians 'Ride to Remember' in February.

Ararat Branch president Dianne Radford said the branch was pleased to be able to present the first instalment towards the anaesthetic machine.

"Since the Ararat Branch of the Victoria Police Blue Ribbon Foundation was formed 22 years ago, we have donated more than \$1 million to East Grampians Health Service, of which our volunteer committee is very proud," Mrs Radford said. "The anaesthetic machine is a vital piece of equipment for the Perioperative Unit, and we are very pleased to donate this equipment to the unit named in honour of Jason Bond."

The anaesthetic machine is used for anaesthetic purposes for every patient who has a procedure in theatre.

The purpose of the anaesthetic machine is for the safe administration of anaesthetic gases, including oxygen, medical air, Nitrous and the actual anaesthetic agents. It also allows for the safe and effective monitoring of the anaesthetised patient at all times throughout their anaesthetic journey.

The anaesthetic machine acts as the lungs for the anaesthetised patient, with the ability to administer the correct amounts of medication required for that patient to have their surgery, in a safe and controlled environment.

EGHS chief executive Nick Bush thanked the Blue Ribbon Foundation Ararat Branch for the first instalment towards, and generous support of, the anaesthetic machine project.

"With the support and dedication of the Blue Ribbon Foundation Ararat branch, partners, businesses, organisations and everyone who annually supports the Ararat Branch's fundraising efforts, we are able to provide state of the art equipment and facilities for our community," Mr Bush said.



HEALTH SERVICE THANKS MAJOR SUPPORTERS JODIE HOLWELL COMMUNITY LIAISON

East Grampians health Service held an afternoon tea to thank its major supporters.

Groups and individuals thanked included the EGHS Murray to Moyne Cranks and Defibrillators, the EGHS Building for the Future Foundation and Monika Kapp.

The Murray to Moyne Cycle Relay teams, have represented EGHS for more than 20 years in the relay, in that time raising approximately \$200,000 for the health service.

Over the past two years, the teams have raised \$16,800 towards the Bone Density Scanner and \$13,638 for two Accella Therapy mattresses.

"The riders and their support crew and bus drivers work hard to raise funds with a variety of fundraisers, such as the Ararat Market and Trivia Nights, raffles as well as individual sponsorship and generous sponsorship from Ararat businesses," EGHS chief executive Nick Bush said.

"Congratulations and thank you for your support of the health service."

The Building for the Future Foundation is a charitable Trust established in 2010 with the purpose of providing funding for staff development, special purpose projects and equipment for East Grampians Health Service. The Trust is governed by six independent local Trustees who manage the Trust's assets and the distribution of funding for the sole benefit of the Health Service.

Recent support includes the funding of three pieces of equipment:

\$38,590 towards the Bone Density Scanner

\$52,910 for the X-ray plate

\$15,150 for the Ultrasound Probe Steriliser

"The Foundation also annually offers scholarships up to the value of \$30,000 to individuals to enhance and develop their knowledge and learn new skills," Mr Bush said.

"In 2020, an additional scholarship was created on behalf of the Estate of Joe Kapp, up to the value of \$15,000. These scholarships are open for both clinical and non-clinical educational support to improve staff retention and to contribute to workforce development and service delivery.

"Thank you for your support of the health service over the past 14 years."

Monika Kapp and her late husband Joe are major supporters of, and donors to, the health service.

"In the past Monika and her late husband Joe have funded our Solar Panel carpark, and most recently provided \$270,000 which allowed the health service to develop an area for our new Team Based Maternity Model staff, including GP Obstetricians, midwives and lactation consultants, in an area previously used by the Health Information staff, behind our front reception area. Also constructed was a welcoming discharge lounge in the Inpatient Unit.

Research Capacity and Culture at EGHS

High research activity in health services has been shown to improve patient outcomes and staff satisfaction. It is therefore crucial to foster strong research capacity and culture.

2023 Research Capacity and Culture Survey Results

Last year, the Research Capacity and Culture Tool was used to survey health service staff in Western Victoria, including at East Grampians Health Service. The survey asked staff to consider research culture and capacity across three levels: organisational, team and individual. Each question was rated on a scale of 1 to 10 (1 being the lowest and 10 the highest).

The survey was completed by 41 staff at EGHS. Here is the summary of the results:



- Organisational level: 7/10
 - o Highest rating: "EGHS requires ethics approval for research activities"
 - Lowest rating: "EGHS provides funds, equipment or admin to support research activities"
- Team level: 7/10
 - Highest rating: "The team provides access to literature searching and article retrieval"
 - o Lowest rating: "The team has incentives and support for mentoring activities"
- Individual level: 6/10
 - o Highest rating: "Capacity to find relevant literature"
 - o Lowest rating: "Capacity to secure research funding"

2024 Action Plan

As a result of this survey, the Development & Improvement Research unit has started implementing a targeted action plan to address areas for improvement and leverage our strengths. Examples include:

- Developing a research-specific communication plan for EGHS.
- Enhancing and promoting opportunities for staff to build their research skills.
- Increasing visibility of research-related information for staff.





2025 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

East Grampians Health Service is pleased to offer several educational support scholarships in partnership with our very generous supporters, the Laidlaw Family, Epworth Healthcare Group, Keith Little, the EGHS Building for the Future Foundation and the Estate of Joe Kapp.

The scholarships are offered to grow and develop the skills of our staff to improve the health, wellbeing and quality of life of our community.

Below is a summary of the opportunities available.

Building for the Future Foundation - Ray & Wayne Ord Scholarship

On behalf of Keith Little, the EGHS Building for the Future Foundation is offering the new Ray and Wayne Ord scholarship available up to the value of \$15,000 to individuals to enhance their clinical or non-clinical skills.

A focus area will be post-graduate studies in speech pathology, podiatry and physiotherapy.


